Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: *Where are the programs going to take place?*

A: Friday programs will be utilizing approximately 4 – 6 classrooms in Rolla’s school. These may vary depending on the numbers of students and types of activities planned. However, some activities will be held in facilities operated by the Rolla Recreation Commission, and at other facilities outside Rolla on occasion.

Q: *Who is paying for everything?*

A: A committee of dedicated teachers, and community members put together the information to apply for a 21st Century After - School Grant. This is a Federal Grant awarded to organizations providing academic help and enrichment for qualifying schools. Many other schools in our area have been providing these programs through 21st Century grants. Here is a basic break-down of how things are funded:

4 Teacher salaries (Fridays & Summer)	-	fully funded by grant
4 Aide salaries - (Fridays & Summer)	-	fully funded by grant
Teaching materials/equipment	-	fully funded by grant
Utilities /building use	-	fully funded by grant
Enrichment materials/equipment	-	fully funded by grant
Student meals on Friday’s	-	fully funded at the state meal rate
Student transportation (Fridays & Summer)	-	fully funded by grant (includes fuel cost, driver salary, mileage reimbursement)
Summer Reading Program in conjunction with Summer Camp		– fully funded
Library salaries for extra hours	-	fully funded
Swimming Lessons in conjunction with Summer Camp	-	Rolla Rec will donate life guard pay, new pool toys and equipment through grant
Parent Classes, Family Nights	-	fully funded/ facilitated through grant

Q: *Will there be any extra costs that the school has to pick up?*

A: No direct costs will be charged to the school. Janitorial services on Fridays will be handled by the ARGH! Staff, bookkeeping and payroll will be run by district at same time as other school requirements with very little added duty.

Q: *Do all students have to attend? What if kids only want to come for part of the day?*

A: ARGH! Fridays are not mandatory. Any student wanting to attend any part of the programs will need to be enrolled. Enrollment will be necessary to participate, though we realize not all students will take advantage of the tutoring and homework opportunities. We are asking teachers to refer students who are not performing at acceptable levels in their classrooms and those students will be *encouraged* to take advantage of the help offered. Any enrolled student may participate in enrichment and recreational activities. Only enrolled students will be included in lunch.

Q: *What if my students do not want to come? Will there be any consequence for not attending if they are referred by a teacher?*

A: ARGH! Fridays and Summer Camp are not mandatory. However, it is the wish of Rolla Schools that all students get whatever assistance they need to accomplish the educational goals of the district. Students needing help, as well as students interested in enrichment activities will be offered tutoring, homework help, and opportunities. Parents and students ultimately must make the decision to participate.
